Module Aims
To apply and demonstrate recent advances, knowledge to deliver innovative First Contact Practitioner (musculoskeletal) services working with other members of the healthcare team to improve patient care and their access to high quality health services.

Outline Syllabus

Undertake physical assessment with an awareness of validity reliability, specificity; sensitivity of investigations, intervention including consideration for management of complex needs; long term conditions incl. ongoing issues with mental health, frailty, dementia, chronic pain; disability. Management plans considering- education and support, lifestyle advice, social prescribing, drug therapies for symptom or disease control, manual therapy techniques and rehabilitation including exercise, signposting including for further advise, Fitness for work (AHP Health and Work Report), advanced clinical reasoning and decision making including onward referral e.g. surgery, mental health support in line with local protocols, guidelines and frameworks and legal professional requirements, monitoring, evaluating outcomes and patient discharge. Understand the importance of ongoing clinical audit, service evaluation, research, personal development plans, engaging with reflective practice, clinical supervision and record learning and development. Advanced communication incl. person centred approach, shared decision making, motivational interviewing, social prescribing, supporting self-care /management, behaviour change, health promotion; coaching, prevention (incl. co-morbidities), advise on expected benefits of e.g. injection therapy, common surgeries, prescribed medication, risk management, stratifying risk and safeguarding (including escalating concerns).

09	Critically analyse and apply the research evidence that informs the development of policy and sustainable service delivery in first contact physiotherapy practice.

Learning, Teaching and Assessment Strategy

The use of Online Lectures (Synchronous) delivery will be offered

Synchronous Online Lectures, tutorials and practical workshops will be used to enhance and develop advanced clinical skills (2,3,4, 7, 8, 9). You will undertake 75 hours of supervised clinical practice with a named GP clinical mentor. You will be assessed in the practice setting using pre-determined capabilities (1, 2, 4, 7, 8) You will maintain a reflective practice diary and use an e-portfolio as a means of demonstrating advanced reflection on practice (5, 6, 8). Directed study will include preparation for clinical practice & development of the practice portfolio.

The assessments will allow the you to demonstrate in depth subject knowledge and develop your verbal and written communication skills (1-9). Throughout the module you will be encouraged to employ a holistic and patient-centred approach within the overall first contact physiotherapy practitioner management of musculoskeletal dysfunction (8). Formal and informal feedback will be given during sessions, whilst on placement, following presentations and during portfolio development (1-9).

Placement capabilities- predetermined clinical capabilities assessed in practice 0% weighting (pass/fail element) Advanced Clinical Practice Portfolio 3000 word commentary plus evidence 100% weighting.
