Module Aims

To provide a critical overview of major global health debates and challenges both in the United Kingdom and globally. To enhance students? knowledge of the determinants of health and health inequalities and their link to current global burden of diseases and the progress towards the sustainable development goals

Outline Syllabus

The module conceptualises current approaches in the global health agenda and its importance to the medical profession. Lectures cover issues such as the global burden of diseases, the determinants of health and health inequalities in comparative global contexts. Students will have the opportunity to develop their knowledge of global health systems organisation and governance and reflect on the implication of this on population health. Lectures are complemented by seminars and practical workshops to explore issues of global health in more detail and increase awareness of specific health issues and challenges. The interactive seminars provide students with an opportunity to contextualise the National Health System within the United Kingdom with a global health system nexus.

Learning, Teaching and Assessment Strategy

The module will be delivered using lectures, individual/group structured reading, discussion and preparation sessions, and seminars. The study sessions and seminars provide a structured environment for students to initiate and carry out independent and group work.

Session material including unit handouts, assigned readings and web links will be made available via Canvas. Students will undertake a short research project and develop a podcast or video for a public health campaign. Students will share an early iteration of their work with peers in a formative feedback session.

Students will undertake an evaluative analysis (critical report) of a selected topic under the guidance of a supervisor, who will provide feedback on the topic and on a report plan (up to 20% of the final report).
