Module Aims
This module aims to familiarise students with the key debates and issues related to the development of the law of evidence and to consider the application of the law of evidence in practice

Outline Syllabus
Nature and classification of various types of evidence (e.g. civil & criminal). Judicial discretion and the functions of the judge and jury. Burden and standard of proof. Examination, cross examination and re-examination; previous consistent statements. Civil Evidence Act 1995. Competence and compellability of witnesses. Corroboration. Identification evidence. Opinion and expert evidence. Evidence of character. Confession evidence. Exclusionary rules of evidence. Hearsay evidence. Criminal Justice Act 2003. Evidence and Human Rights. Right to silence. Disclosure.

Learning, Teaching and Assessment Strategy
<p>This module covers the law of evidence in a variety of contexts and introduces you to the key issues and debates in this area of law. Through lectures and seminars you will explore the law and discuss and debate issues arising from its application. Lectures will deliver core content; providing students with the opportunity to acquire the information to enhance their knowledge and understanding of key issues. This groundwork will be complemented by tutorials, each of which will be based on a key contemporary issue in company law. The tutorials will provide a forum to analyse these issues, employing group work and case studies by students.</p> <p>Active participation by all students is required in all tutorials and, where appropriate lectures, in order to engage with the module. During tutorials, verbal feedback will be provided to students regarding their work and there will be an opportunity to submit formative written work for feedback prior to the summative coursework that tests all five learning outcomes.</p>
