Module Aims

The module will equip the trainee Nursing Associate with the skills and knowledge required to monitor and improve the quality of care.

Outline Syllabus

Giving and receiving feedback; de-escalation; difficult conversations; delegation; being a role model for others; human and environmental factors and team-working; using qualitative and quantitative data to monitor care quality; prioritising and evaluating holistic care; handover of care; major incidents; recognising and dealing with risk and uncertainty, personal resilience and seeking support; venepuncture; falls prevention; medicines storage transportation and disposal; supporting self-administration of medication.
