## Module Aims

The aim of this module is to develop and build on clinical reasoning and diagnostic skills required to inform the delivery of evidence based, safe and effective family centred care across care settings. You will explore the challenges of effective communication in managing integrated care for children and young people and evaluate the implementation of local and national contemporary healthcare policy and practice.

## **Outline Syllabus**

Using appropriate and evidence based assessment tools assisted by a digital platform, assess, plan, manage, deliver and review the care of children and families appropriate to their development.

Develop the use of integrated care pathways, follow local and national guidelines and across care settings for the following Meningitis, diabetes, wounds, burns and scalds, febrile convulsions, orthopaedic conditions and trauma, Sudden unexplained death.

Understand prematurity and congenital conditions.

Develop an understanding of ethical, legal and professional issues in relation to stabilisation of acutely ill children, management of ventilation, management of cardiac conditions.

Using evidence-based pain assessment tools assess and manage pain in children.

How to care for the unconscious child, and develop partnerships with families.

Understand complex drug management.

Develop communication skills; in relation to clinical reasoning and diagnostic thinking and working with multiagency professionals.

Develop health promotion and disease prevention strategies in relation to children.

Understand child mental health. Understand the significance of adverse childhood experiences.

This will be complemented by theme based practical activities and supported by group work, seminars and a group presentation to enable you to apply your learning to evaluate care, organisation and service delivery for children and families. Virtual Learning Environments and digital technology will be used to provide access to online resources, reading lists, lecture notes and external links to websites of interest.
