Learning, Teaching and Assessment Strategy

Most of your work for this module will be self-directed and independent. There will be organised sessions to support students in understanding the process of developing and completing a postgraduate dissertation, and in developing your research literacy and skills. Individual supervision will provide guidance on the key stages of work, from the development of a relevant topic and research focus and the drafting of the dissertation text.

The precise format of your dissertation will depend on the nature of your research and the chosen methodology. Each project will, however, include a clear articulation of research questions and objectives, evidence of critical engagement with relevant literature, a discussion of methodological issues (including a consideration of ethical questions where appropriate), and effective discussion and analysis leading to clear, supported conclusions. Your work should demonstrate your achievement of the module learning outcomes and this will be the main focus of assessment.

The methodology appropriate to your research will be negotiated with your supervisor. Appropriate ethics approval must be obtained in accordance with the Department's ethics approval process.

The module will be assessed through the submission of a portfolio of work. The main element of this will be the dissertation itself - a major piece of writing (14,000 words). The portfolio will also contain evidence of the process through which the dissertation was authentically developed and realised by the student. This will be specified in the Canvas module, but is likely to include a research proposal, ethics approval, evidence of engagement with supervision, and evidence of authenticity.
