Learning, Teaching and Assessment Strategy
<p>Lectures will introduce key theoretical concepts. Group discussions will encourage reflection upon the 'normative' with reference to the lived experience of students. Consideration of data and cases studies of local, national and international phenomena will place norms and commonly held values into perspective and offer fresh insight into theoretical ideas and explanations of cultural production and the relationship between the individual and larger grouping or society.</p> <p>Assessment is a 3-stage process intended to help students develop their research and critical thinking skills whilst reflecting critically upon the themes and theorists introduced in the module. In stage 1, students will conduct individual observations of normative behaviours on campus. In stage 2 they will synthesise knowledge and understandings via a guided Teams discussion. In stage 3, they will produce a short, 5-minute video discussing their findings and the outcome of the group discussion as applied to relevant academic writing and theory.</p>
