Learning, Teaching and Assessment Strategy
<p>By adopting a blended learning approach, teaching and learning will take place both online and on campus through a series of lectures and seminars. Within these sessions, you will be asked to take an active role by contributing to large and small group discussions as a means of further developing your ideas. (LO 1 and 4). With the support of the Module lead, you are expected to complete a support plan for a young person who is attending school and has additional support needs. Through the course of the assignment you will be reflecting on wider issues and their impact on the young person (LO 1-3), whilst reflectively engaging with academic literature in order to develop a suitable support plan (LO 1-4).</p>
